## Flying high

ACROSS Brimbank, almost 3000 students are coming to terms with their tertiary ENTER score, measuring their effort over their VCE study.

For the high achievers who scored 90 and above, the results were an almost certain guarantee of entry into the course of their choice.

Catholic Regional College dux Cleon Soares was one of the first across the state to find out his ENTER of 97.25 about 6.45am last Monday, and was still on cloud nine.

The 17-year-old from Sydenham said he would complete a year of science at Melbourne University before deciding whether to continue with engineering or medicine.

Despite the rigours of study, Cleon said year 12 had been a good one.

“It was stressful but friends made it OK,” he said.

Cleon credited the teachers at CRC for helping him through.

Schoolmate Kristy Mansour, 17, from Hillside, was tossing up between a career as a rock star or surgeon before she registered an ENTER of 96.65.

The exceptional result means she will now aim for medicine, either at local or interstate university despite having recently acquired a new guitar.

CRC’s Jayden Blanco, 18, of Taylors Lakes had to double-check his ENTER of 96.6.

Jayden focussed his study efforts on his best subjects, a full range of maths and physics, and would now be assured entry into either aerospace or engineering at RMIT.
